

# European PhD Symposium

*Budapest (Hungary),  
31 May - 2 June 2007*

- A symposium promoting the research work of PhD students in nuclear fields, within the European Union is initiated by the European Nuclear Education Network Association in the framework of its project ENEN-II “Consolidation of European Nuclear Education, Training and Knowledge Management”.
- The symposium is organized as a special session of the *International Youth Conference on Energetics 2007* (<http://www.iyce2007.org>).
- This symposium provides a forum for PhD students to present their research work to their fellow researchers, both students and staff, in a friendly but competitive spirit.
- The students are drawn from similar European national events where such events do exist or can be nominated by an ENEN member or a participant to the ENEN-II project.
- Students will be judged on the quality of their presentation and the clarity in the discussion while answering the questions from the panel of judges.
- The three best PhD presentations will be sponsored by ENEN to participate in the European Nuclear Conference 2007 to be held in Brussels, Belgium, 16-20 September 2007.



- The session is scheduled on the *1<sup>st</sup> June, 2007* as a one day event. The three winning papers will be announced and the students will be presented with a prize during the closing ceremony of the IYCE-2007 conference.
- General:
  - In order to participate to IYCE-2007, *PhD students have to register* to the IYCE-2007 conference *not later than 9<sup>th</sup> March, 2007*. The registered students are entitled to attend all events of the whole conference (plenary lectures, technical tours, cultural and social events etc.) (<http://www.iyce2007.org/registration.php>).
  - In order to present a paper at the ENEN PhD Special Session, the students have to be nominated by an ENEN member or ENEN-II participant and send the abstract of their presentation to the ENEN secretariat *not later than 26<sup>th</sup> February, 2007*. The reason for the nomination should be given by the nominating professor. The papers of the registered students will be published in the conference proceedings.
  - Upon request, *ENEN offers 50-100% reduction* of the registration fee and some travel/accommodation support for a limited number of ENEN and ENEN-II nominated participants of the PhD Symposium.
  - The evaluation of the papers will be done by the Jury Panel during the ENEN Meetings on March 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2007, for (1) limiting the number of presentations to 20 if necessary, and for (2) awarding the ENEN support to a selection of the nominated participants.



- Students are expected to give a 15 minute presentation with 5 minutes for questions and discussion.
- Students may present their results in *any nuclear field*.
